WEST PEAK OF CROWN TIP - May 21-22.

A party of twelve left the Club Cabin on Sunday at 7:30 and followed the usual route to Crown Mt. as far as the Pass; from there we turned down the Capilano side of the pass to the gully between the West and Main peaks to Crown. The going was good, and we made good time up the gully, reaching the ridge about noon, when we decided it was time for lunch.

After lunch we ascended the short distance to the peak, but we did not linger as the view was not very satisfactory, most of the peaks being enveloped in clouds.

The return trip was accomplished without untoward incident and the Cabin was reached about 4 o'clock.

EAGLE LAKE.

As the Mt. Brunswick trip on May 29th. was cancelled, eight members answered the hurried call of the Natural History Section, and left for a trip to Cypress Falls. Six of the party continued on to Eagle Lake which rests at the base of the South East shoulder of Black Mt. The trail to this lake is a well defined and exceedingly interesting one, owing to the variety of forest growth and the wonderful views of the City and the Gulf. Mr. Christie made the trip even more interesting by telling us of the trees and their enemies, as we travelled along the trail. The party spent half an hour at the lake, foot bathing and watching fishermen who were evidently catching their share of mountain trout judging by the use being made of their landing nets.

For those who want a good hike, with enough climbing and beautiful scenery to make it interesting this trip is recommended and also it is possibly another easy route over Black Mt. to Horseshoe Bay.
